## Application guide for Skin Tears

#### Please read the instructions for use carefully.

ISTAP (International Skin Tear Advisory Panel) - Skin Tear Classification Skin tears are classified into 3 types. Effective treatment depends on the type of skin tear.

Type 1 • No skin loss, the skin flap can be repositioned to cover the wound bed

- Type 2 Partial skin loss, partial skin flap loss that cannot be repositioned over the wound bed
- Type 3 Full skin loss, total skin flap loss, exposing the entire wound bed Ref: Le Blanc et al, 2013. ISTAP Skin Tear Classification

### CONTRAINDICATIONS

- Do not use if you have a known allergy to one of the components
- Do not apply to eyelids or in the eye. Should it come into contact with your eye, rinse the eye thoroughly

For moderately to highly exuding wounds

Your nurse/doctor will advise you to use Hydro or Forte depending on your wound type

## **TYPE1** No skin loss

**Step 1** Cleanse your skin tear with clean water or a specific wound cleansing product such as Flamirins<sup>®</sup> if advised by your nurse/doctor

**Step 2** Ease the skin flap back into place using a gloved finger, dampened cotton tip, tweezers or a silicone strip

**Step 3** Cover with a non-adhesive silicone-coated net dressing

**Step 4** Place a secondary non-adhesive dressing on top of the non-adhesive net dressing and fix with a bandage

- > Daily Change the non-adhesive secondary dressing
- > Remove the non-adhesive net dressing after 5/7 days
- > DO NOT APPLY STERISTRIPS



## **TYPE 2** Partial skin loss

**Step 1** Cleanse your skin tear with clean water or a specific wound cleansing product such as Flamirins<sup>®</sup> if advised by your nurse/doctor

**Step 2** Cover with a non-adhesive silicone-coated net dressing

**Step 3** Apply a thick layer of Flaminal<sup>®</sup> Hydro to the site of tissue loss (approx. 0.5cm) over the net dressing

**Step 4** Place a secondary non-adhesive dressing on top of the non-adhesive net dressing and fix with a bandage

- > Daily Cleanse the wound and re-apply Flaminal<sup>®</sup> Hydro and the non-adhesive secondary dressing daily.
- > Remove the non-adhesive net dressing after 5/7 days



### **TYPE 3** Complete tissue loss

**Step 1** Cleanse your skin tear with clean water or a specific wound cleansing product such as Flamirins<sup>®</sup> if advised by your nurse/doctor

**Step 2** Cover with a non-adhesive silicone-coated net dressing

**Step 3** Apply a thick layer of Flaminal<sup>®</sup> Hydro / Forte to the site of tissue loss (approx. 0.5cm) over the net dressing

**Step 4** Place a secondary non-adhesive dressing on top of the non-adhesive net dressing and fix with a bandage

- > Daily Cleanse the wound and re-apply Flaminal<sup>®</sup> Hydro and the non-adhesive secondary dressing daily.
- > Remove the non-adhesive net dressing after 5/7 days
